Ride and Stride Coffee Morning

The coffee morning was held on the 10th of September in the Church Hall Morning coffee and light refreshments plus light lunches were on offer. This year it was well supported

The annual Ride and Stride Day, held on connection with the Devon Historic Churches Fund raised £270. vouchers with £80 and a telephone number is provided so you can claim them. This scam is easy to detect as the figure is given as $80\pounds$.

Probably calling the number will result in a hefty phone bill, the caller being directed to a premium number.

Finally there is a warning about stolen Irish (Northern) bank notes. Some time ago a bank in northern Ireland was raided, the wrongdoers getting away with a considerable amount of paper money. As the notes were new and un issued they were easily cancelled but are are now appearing in circulation in England. Recently three shops in South Molton have been caught out by them so the rule is not to accept NI paper money which ever way it is offered.

Help keep Atherington safe by being vigilant and reporting anything suspicious to the police. Don't forget to let Chris at the Village Shoppe know.

LIBRARY SERVICE - FUTURE ASSURED



Over the last few years the future of the Devon Library Service has hung in the balance what with reduced use and limited funds. Recent changes mean Devon libraries, including the mobile service, are now on the up with a rosy future ahead.

Now known as Libraries Unlimited, it has been separated from Devon County Council and is owned by its staff and the community. The service enjoys charitable status but is still financed by the County with the added freedom to develop new ways of generating income.

New branches are planned, also providing more and varied services. Already the magazine service Zinio is available providing library users with many popular magazines titles and subjects. These include music, family history, New Scientist, and National Geographic and photography titles. Cookery and gardening feature in the list along with women's titles, sport and computing. In fact there is something for everyone and all ages.

You can borrow or have the use of up to 12 books, 4 CDs (music or audio books), 4 DVDs, 4 language courses, 3 eBooks or eAudiobooks and emagazines (no limit).

To have access to the free services available, including the mobile library van all that is required is that you join. To find out more either visit the mob lie van which visits The Square every four weeks or pop along to the library in Barnstaple.

Drones Over Atherington

Radio controlled drones (quadcopters) have been noted flying over the village. At times these are of concern to residents, frighten livestock causing them to escape from fields and resulting in damage. They are now very cheap, starting at around just £15 and may be flown by anyone but they can be a nuisance. Here are a few hints from a reputable source to keep flyers on the right side of the law.



Your remote controlled aircraft is designed for fun, but you must also remember to take due care whenever you use it. Under UK law remote controlled aircraft flown on a commercial basis or that are fitted with cameras are treated as standard aircraft. Please observe the appropriate laws when flying and also consider the safety of anyone that may be nearby. Be sure not to frighten livestock wherever they may be..

Remember

1. You are totally responsible for the safe conduct of each flight.

2. You must keep the drone within your sight at all times.

3. You are responsible for avoiding collisions with other people or objects – including aircraft, plan your flights beforehand if necessary.

4. You must keep your drone at least 150m away from a congested rea (such as residential streets, town centres etc).

5. You must not fly your drone within 50m of a person, vehicle, building or structure, or over groups of people at any height.

6. If you intend to use your aircraft (with camera) for any kind of paid work you must obtain permission from the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA).

7. Never fly your aircraft near any airport, airfield or power installation (such as substations and pylons) This is not a toy, these are aircraft and subject to UK Aviation Law. Anyone breaking the law can face criminal prosecution.

Go to www.caa.co.uk/uas for the full details on how to use your aircraft safely.

If your remote controlled aircraft is capable of taking images please also observe the following:

In accordance with Data Protection legislation (Data Protection Act 1998) consent should be obtained from any individual who is the focus of a video recording in order to process his/her personal data fairly. Where a recording involves individuals other than the main players, then, in some circumstances, the images of other individuals may constitute personal data and the data protection regime may come into play, particularly where the video conveys information of biographical significance to the individual concerned. However, where filming takes place in a public place, the fact that a passer-by is captured in the film in the background and is able to be identified by individuals who know him/her does not in itself make the image personal data and consent is unlikely to be required to put the video on YouTube or incorporate it in an Open Educational Resource (OER).
